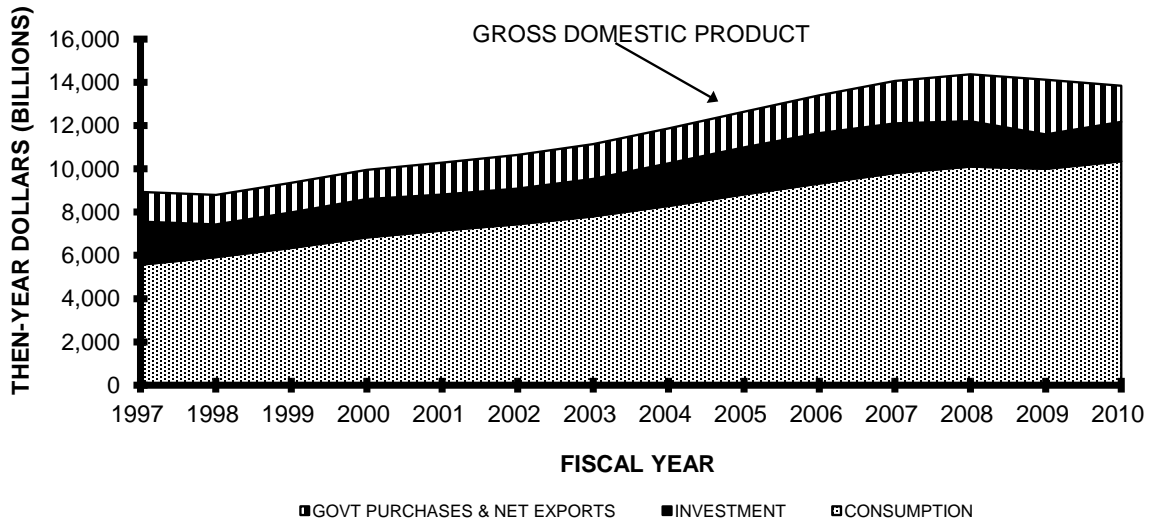

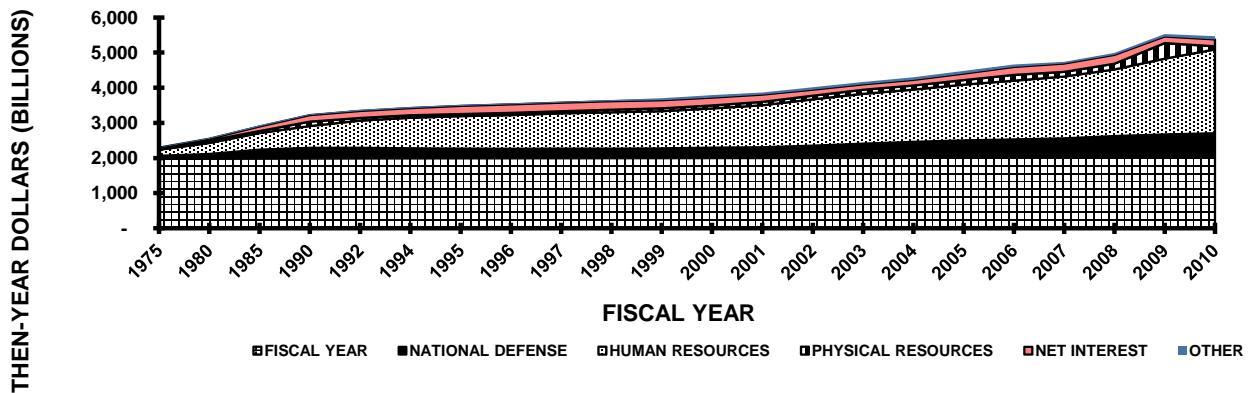

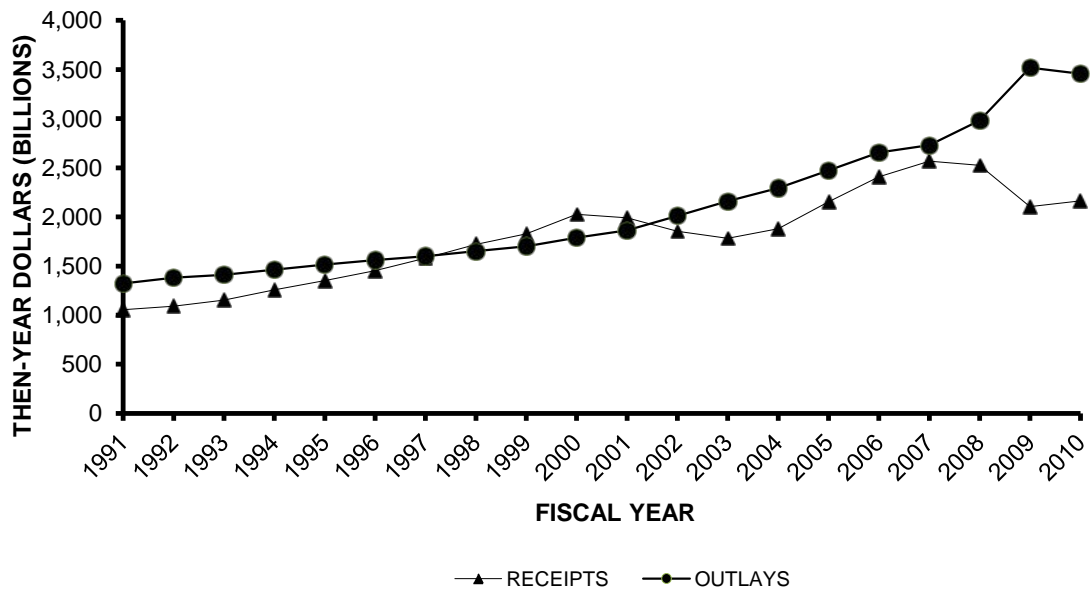

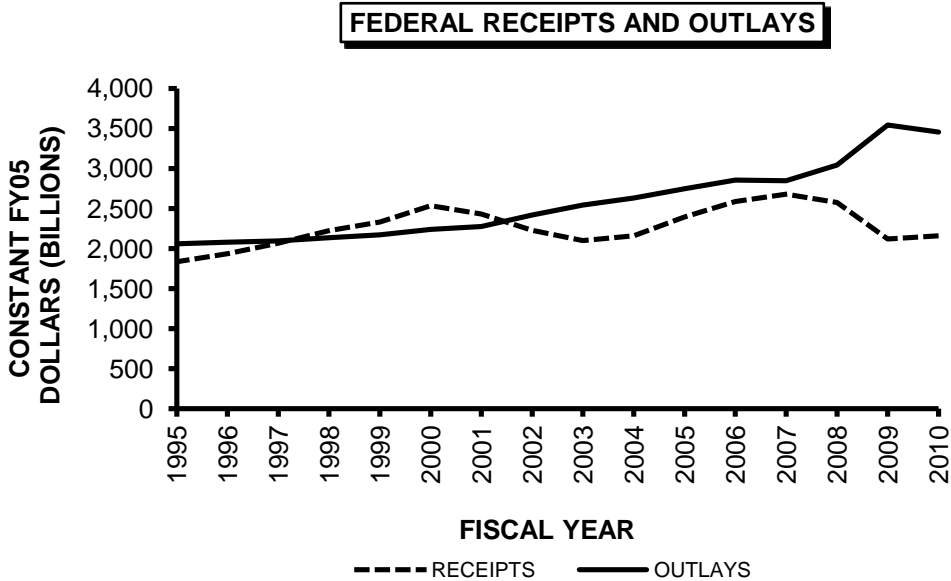

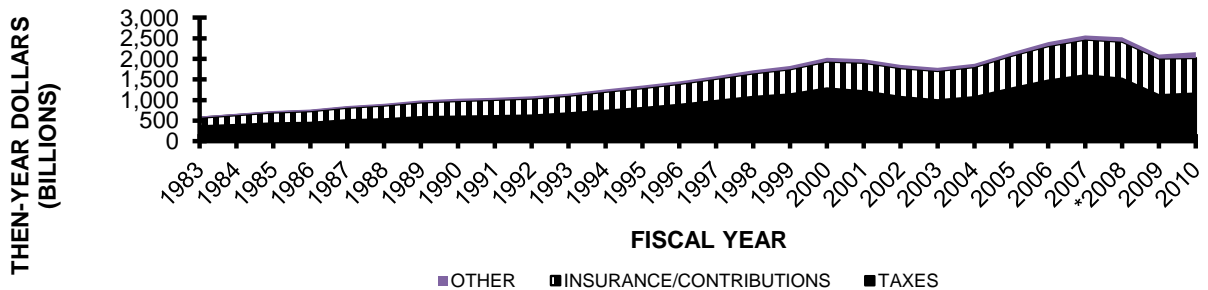

Figure 1 - Composition of Receipts by Source

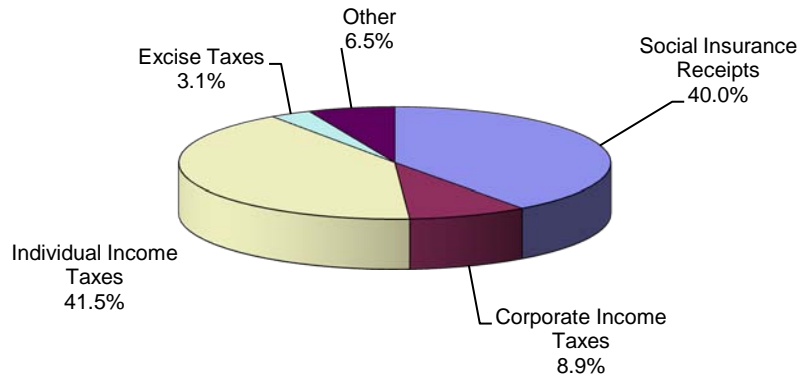
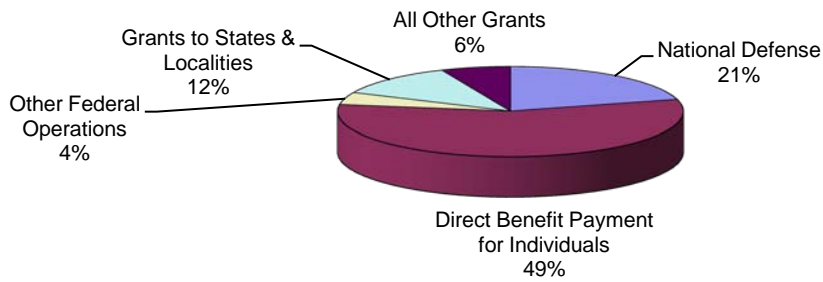


Figure 2 - Composition of Outlays (1)



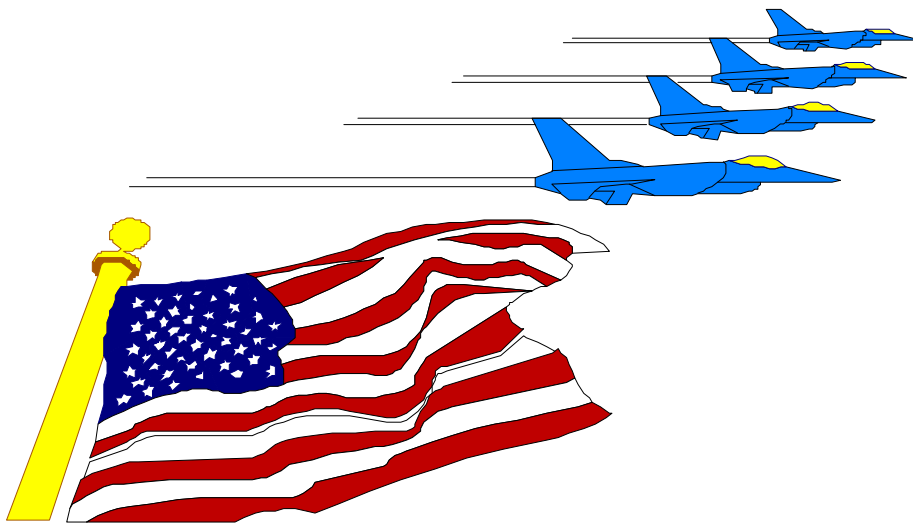

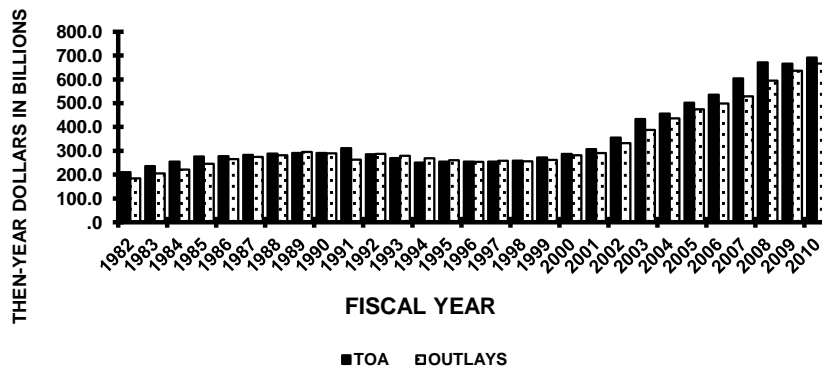

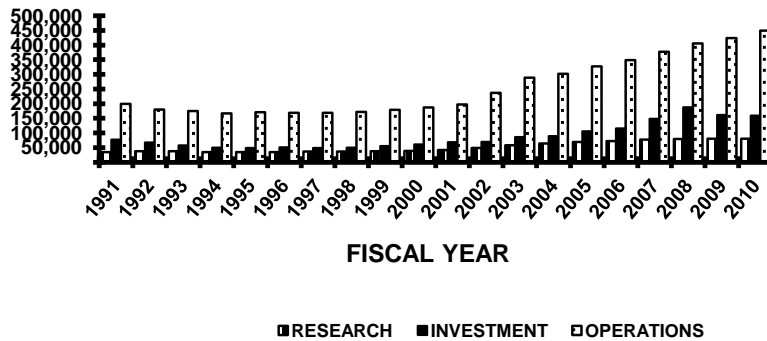

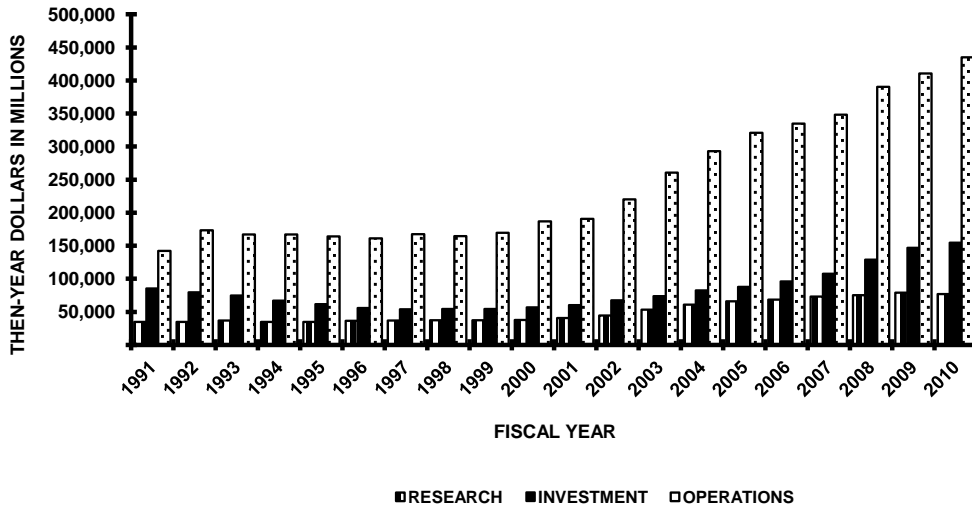

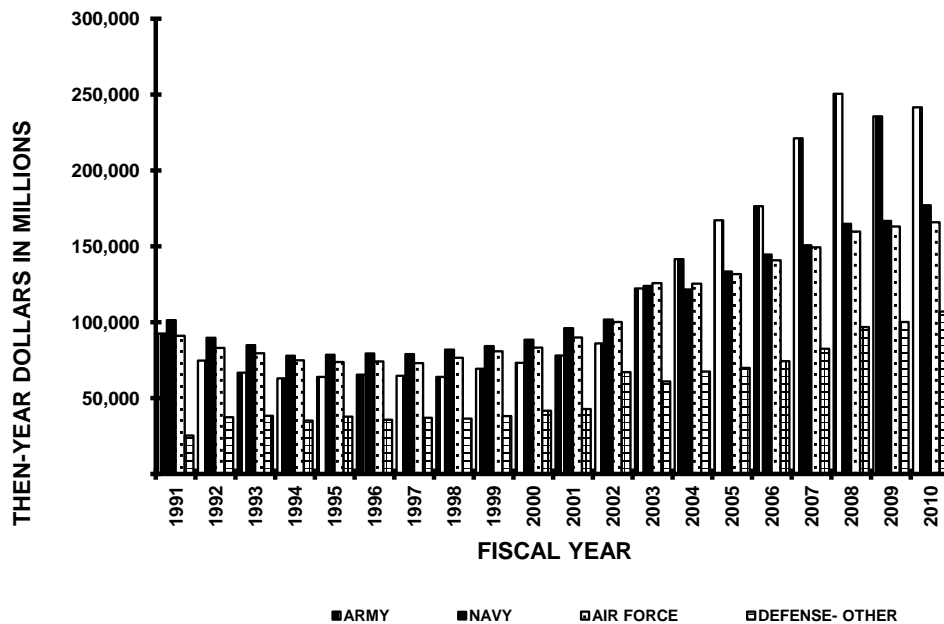

DoD TOA BY SERVICE



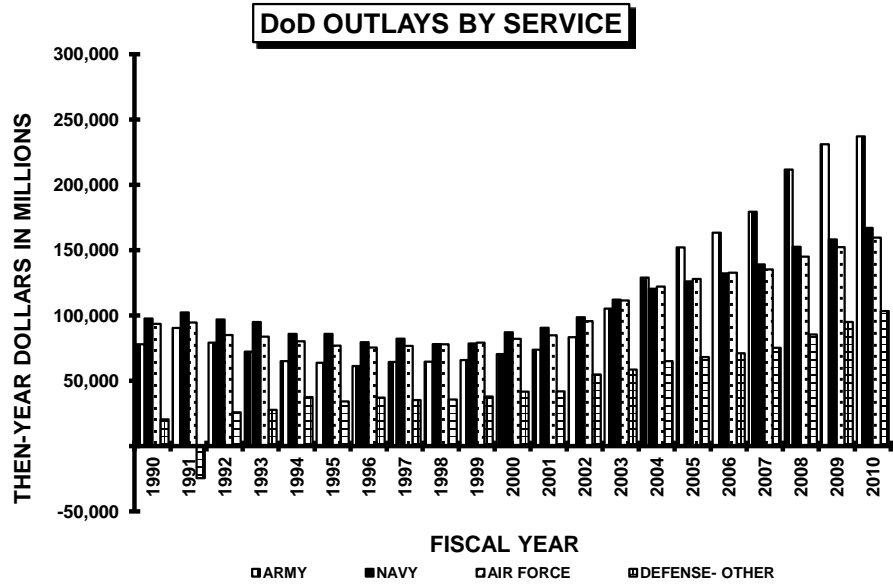

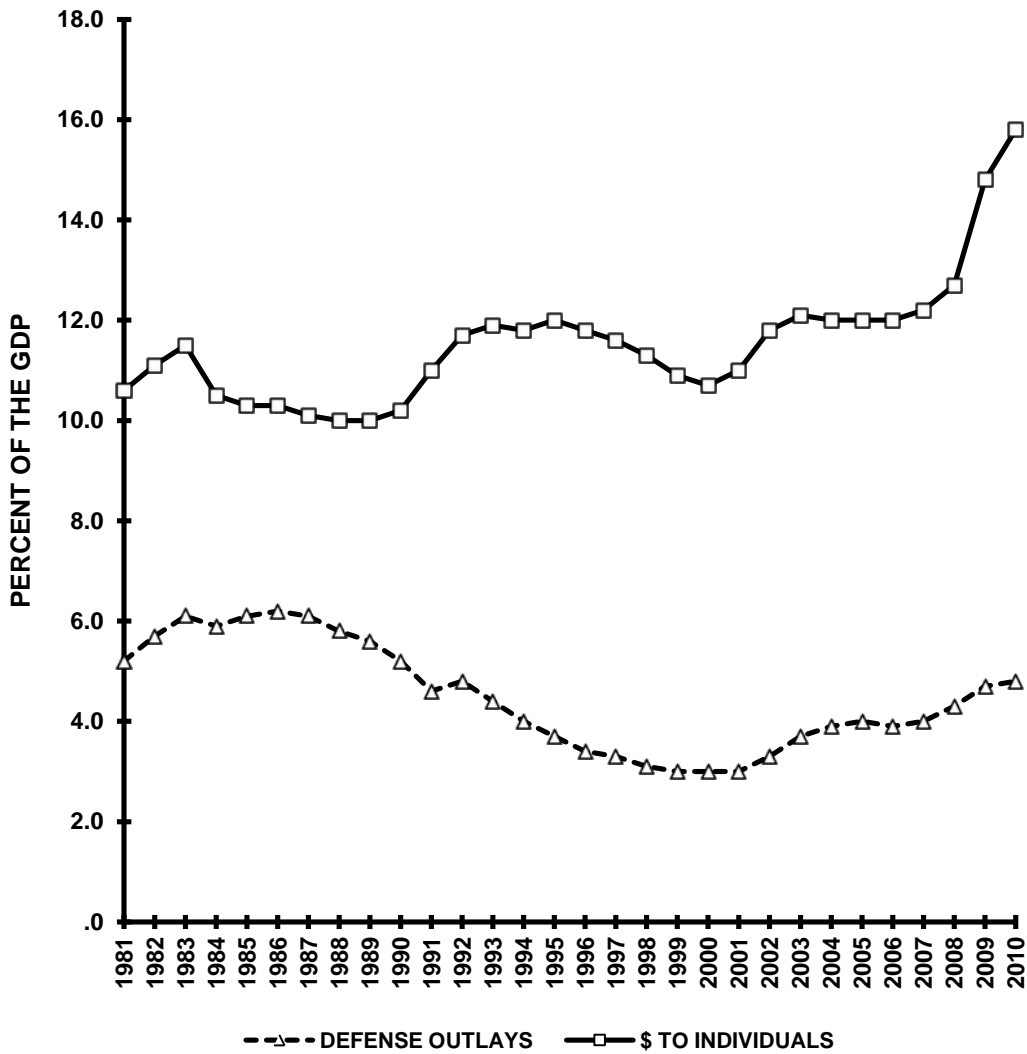

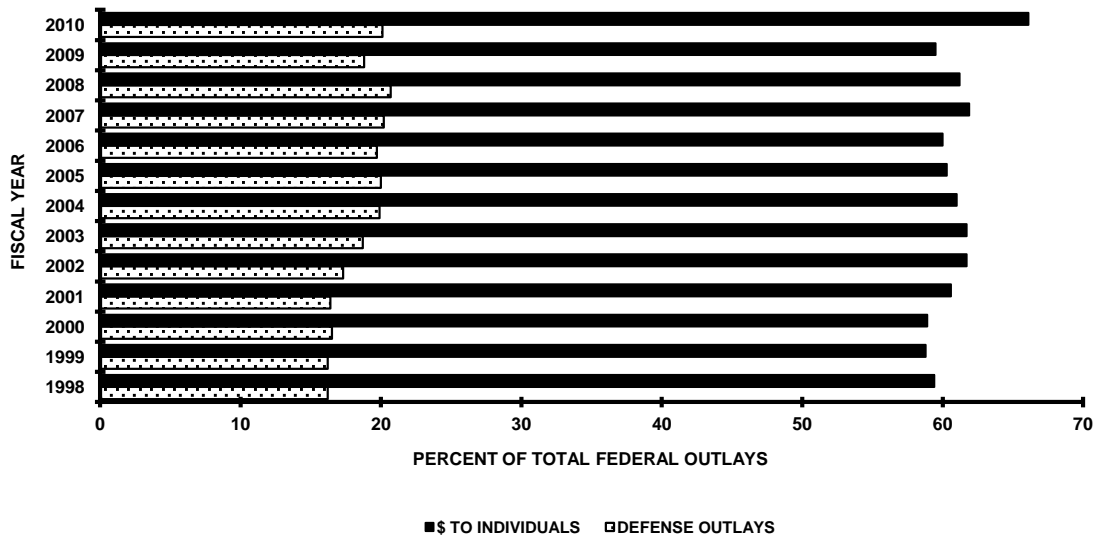

DEFENSE OUTLAYS vs. PAYMENT TO INDIVIDUALS

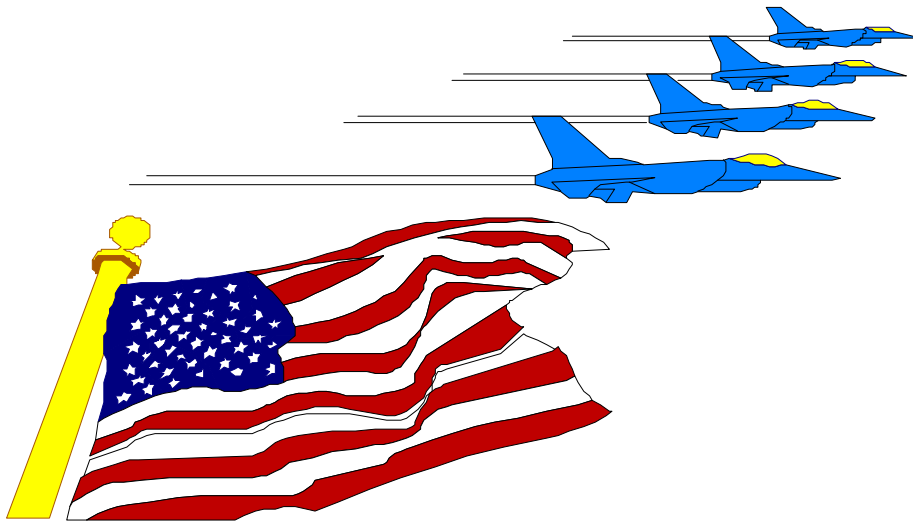

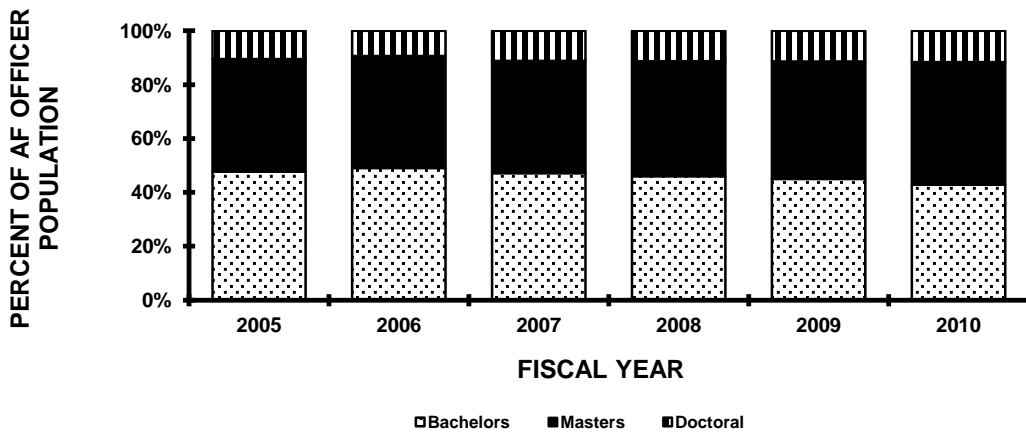

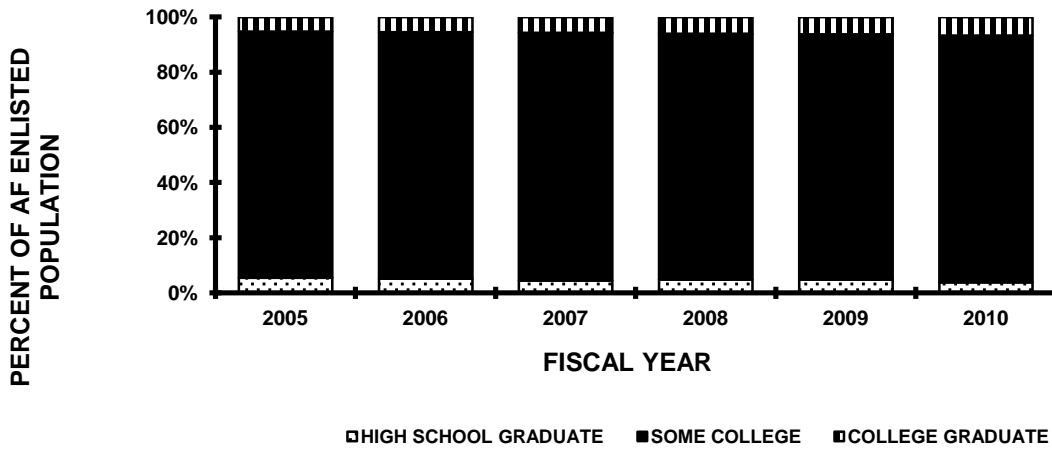
